The average traveler spends 13% of their time online conducting travel-related activities.<sup>1</sup>

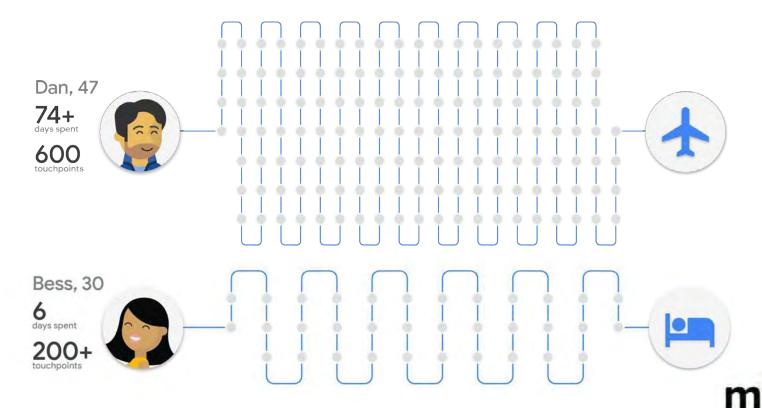

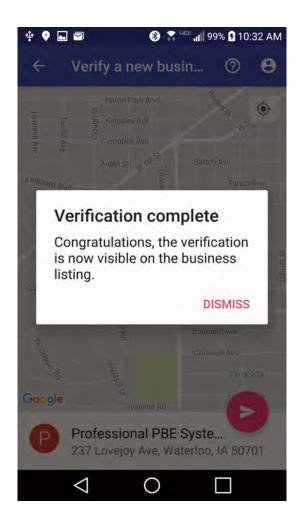
# RIP Trusted Verifier App

- Replaced by new tool: My Business Provider



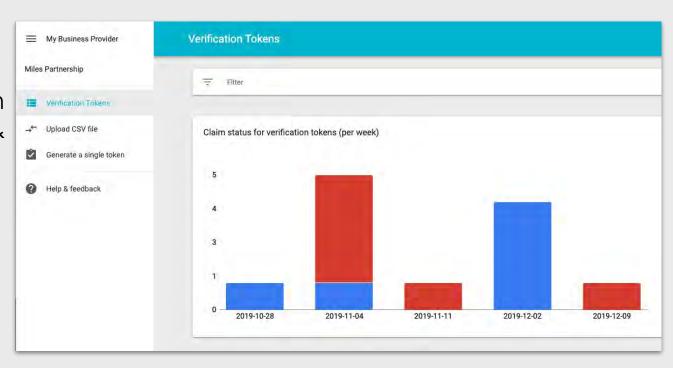


# A Better Tool For DMOs

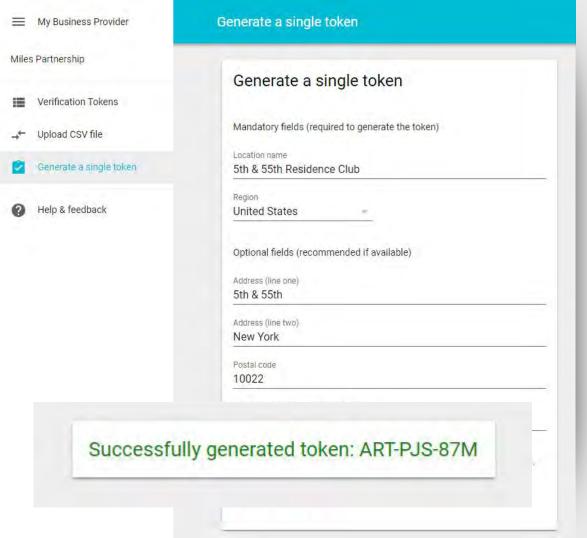
Web-based application allows use on Android & iOS as well as desktop devices

Improved tracking of verification status

No in-person visit required to verify a business





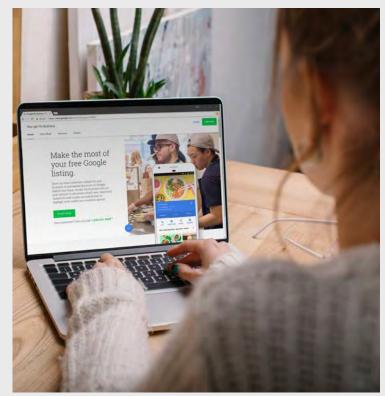


The tool allows users to generate a single verification code, or bulk upload several businesses at once.

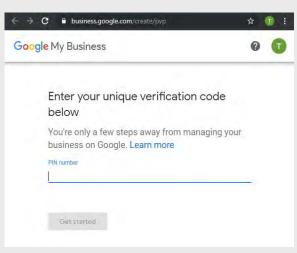
All you need to do is supply the verification code to the relevant business.

Code is valid for 90 days.









To complete the verification, the owner will need to **login to the account** that will become the owner of the business then **visit this URL:** g.co/pinverify and enter their unique verification code miles

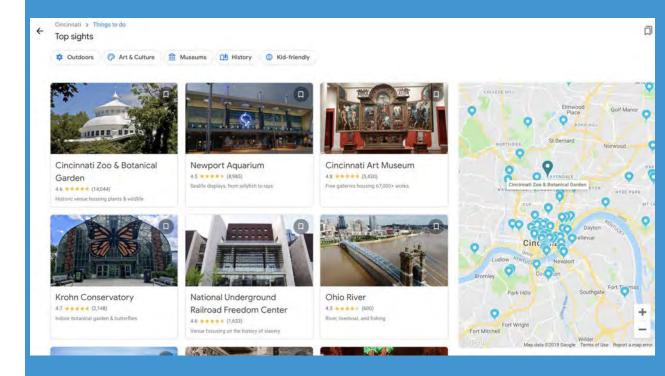
# Top Sights Redesign

Changes are a blend of elements we'd seen in mobile search and functionality from the Trips app.

# Redesign of Top Sights in the Travel Guide September 2019





The section now features up to 100 points of interest, and clicking on an individual location opens up business information panel and then pushes to search results.

This could potentially increase the opportunity for organic traffic to DMO sites that rank well in searches for individual POIs.

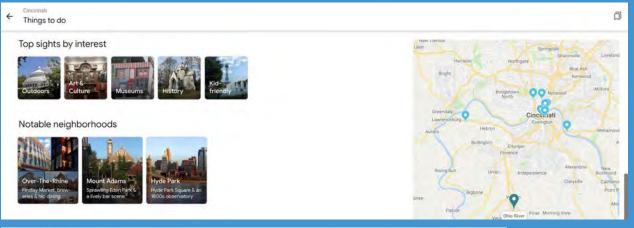

Google called out significant increases in searches for "local" businesses in 2019 as part of its Small Business Search Trends.

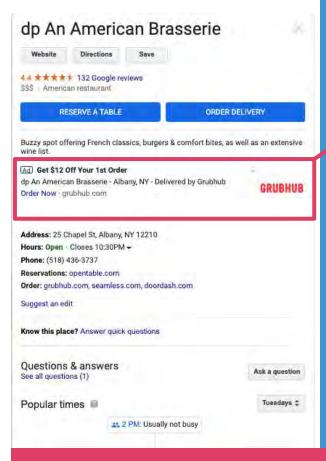
More people are turning to Google when looking for information about nearby businesses
